

FRONTLINE MESSENGER TRAINING COURSE OUTLINE



Introduction

The following document gives an outline of the training which will take place during the Frontline Messenger Training program. While this outline seeks to give prospective students a better idea of the program, there may be changes to the program to meet the needs of the students as well as based on the mission work they will be involved in. This is especially true of Phases 2 and 3 of the training.

All prospective students are required to read this document as well as the Student Handbook **before** applying for the training.

Application Process

- 1.) Read the **PDF information documents**. (This one and the Student Handbook)
- 2.) Fill out the **Application Form** on our website
- 3.) Send the Reference Form to your **2 Character References** to Fill out.
- 4.) After prayer and internal discussion we will let you know if you are invited for an **online video interview**.
- 5.) We will schedule a **1 hour** online video interview with you.
- 6.) After more **prayer** and **discussion** we will let you know if you are accepted to join the training
- 7.) Then complete the **Phase 0: Preparation** before arriving at the training program (See information below)

Goal of the Training

This training is not for everyone. It is specifically for those young men* (18-35 years old) who want to get involved in full-time tent-making evangelism. These young men must be spiritually and mentally mature and have a heart for following God's will and not their own.

We will **not be accepting** students who just want "an experience," but for those who are willing to give their lives for mission. We are **not accepting** those young men who only want to spend a few months of training and then return to their normal jobs or studies.

*We are not able to accept young women at this time due to a variety of factors ranging from limited housing options, to lack of female staff, to the non-feasibility of us sending young women in pairs developing countries due to safety concerns.

PHASE 0: PREPARATION

After being accepted to the training program there are a number of assignments that must be completed prior to the starting of PHASE 1.

1.) You will need to complete at **Territorial Information Form** (TIF) for the country in which you plan to do evangelism after the training. (You can find a template for this in the documents to download on our website) Even if you end up working in another country than the one planned this work will still be important for you to do.

2.) You will also need to complete at **TIF** for the country where you will complete Phase 2 of the training. (We will speak with you about which country that will be)

3.) There is also certain **assigned reading** that you will need to complete before arriving at the training program:

5.) Start memorizing the chapters **1 Corinthians 13 & Psalm 1**

PHASE 1: SWORD

(Soul-Winner Only Rightly Dividing)

This phase will cover a period of 2 months and will be located in Pra del Torno, Angrogna, Italy. During this phase, the students will be instructed in the following topics:

PERSONAL EVANGELISM

In these classes you will learn how to meet people, get in contact, and then lead them to Jesus. Learn how to prepare and give your own Bible studies on any topic or question that you meet in the mission field. You will be given a number of assignments to prepare your own Bible studies and practice going through the Bible studies with the other students in the course.

PUBLIC EVANGELISM

In addition to learning how to share with people one-on-one, learn how to prepare and share in front of groups of people. You will be challenged to prepare short sermons on various topics and present them before the class.

MISSIONAL BUSINESS

Learn from our mistakes and successes in running a successful missional business and become a self-supporting missionary. Discover the principles of evangelistic business where you can make money but also share the gospel through the work you do.

BIBLICAL ANATOMY & PHYSIOLOGY

Be challenged with scripture memory. Learn important passages of scripture by heart, and also memorize important verses connected with Adventist beliefs.

PRACTICAL TRAINING

Learn some various basics of country living such as gardening, preparing firewood, etc.. Also as God opens the way find ways to help the community with these basic skills to find a way to their hearts. Additionally this time of physical work will keep your mind clear for the challenging mental work that you will find in the course.

Learning by doing is a very important principle of this training course. It's important that students are self-motivated, not needing to be led by the hand. You will be challenged with the assignments as we try to make the work as realistic as possible in connection for when you are in the mission field.

PHASE 2: FIRE

(Foreign Intense Real Evangelism)

This phase will cover a period of 1 month, and the location of the training may vary depending on the possibility but will probably take place in a developing country in Asia or Africa. The goal of this portion of the training is to put into practical use that which has been learned in the first phase of the training. There will be assignments during this phase with regular reporting to the Frontline Messenger team regarding the progress and challenges met. The assignments will include but not be limited to:

PREACHING EVANGELISTIC SERIES

During your time in the target country you will be called upon to use what you have learned in Phase 1 of the training and to preach and share with the local people on Biblical doctrines and prophecy.

GIVING BIBLE STUDIES

Additional to preaching, you will have opportunity to give Bible studies to local people who are either Christian or not. This may also be part of discipling and helping to train local people who will continue the work of evangelism when you are finished there.

ORGANIZING OTHER EVANGELISM PROJECT

This part of your assignment will be quite flexible as to your talents and the needs of those in the country you are assigned. The different projects/events that you organize can include, but not be limited to: music evangelism, basic medical missionary work, christian help work, literature work, etc.

TRAINING LOCALS

All that you have learned in the first phase of training will now be necessary to help transmit to local members and missionaries to help them complete their mission. The goal is that others will continue working even after you are not there anymore.

This phase of training will again be a lot of learning by doing. The students cannot successfully accomplish this phase of training without God's help.

The students will be minimum working together in pairs in the target country and will not be sent alone. They will also be working together with a local missionary or local Adventist ministry. This will allow the students to both support the local work as well and learn from the work being done by those in the target country. It should be a synthesis of both parties giving and receiving.

PHASE 3: CONCLUSION

This phase will cover a period of 2 weeks. And it will be to conclude and debrief about the previous months of the course. Students will then be helped and counseled how to begin their own mission project.

Phase 1 Daily Program Example

Below is an example of how the day might be organized during the Phase 1 of training. (This schedule is subject to change and serves only as an example)

05:30-07:00	Wake up and Personal Devotions (shower/get dressed/etc.)
07:00-07:30	Group Devotional
07:30-08:00	Prepare Breakfast
08:00-09:00	Breakfast
09:00-12:00	Classes, Assignments, Physical Work
12:00-13:00	Prepare Lunch
13:00-14:00	Lunch
14:00-14:30	Clean-up
14:30-18:30	Classes, Assignments, Physical Work
18:30-19:30	Optional: Light Supper & Clean-up
19:30-20:30	Phone and Internet Time
20:30-21:30	Prepare for Bed
21:30	Lights Out

The daily schedule for Phase 2 will be dependent on the location and needs of the mission there. Prepare to be flexible!
